Program-related Questions

Q1: Can KUBS GMBA students take more than 45 credits without extra charges?

A1: Yes, KUBS GMBA encourages academic exploration by allowing students to take additional credits beyond the required 45 without incurring extra costs.

Q2: Are students in the KUBS GMBA program allowed to pursue more than one concentration?

A2: Yes, students have the flexibility to pursue multiple concentrations out of the six offered, enabling them to tailor their education to their specific career goals and interests.

Q3: Is there a lottery system for class registration in the KUBS GMBA program?

A3: No, there is no lottery system for class registration, allowing students the freedom to enroll in any available class of their choice.

Life at KUBS Questions

Q4: What is a typical day like for KUBS GMBA students?

A4: A typical day varies depending on individual schedules and selected modules. Academic classes are offered from 8:30 AM to 9:50 PM, Monday through Thursday, with exact schedules differing per student. Fridays are dedicated to career-focused classes, emphasizing the program's comprehensive academic offerings.

Q5: Is there support for learning Korean at KUBS?

A5: Yes, Korean language courses are available, ranging from introductory (modules 1 & 2) to advanced (modules 4 & 5) levels.

Q6: Can students participate in MBA club activities?

A6: Yes, GMBA students have the opportunity to join the GMBA student council and various other clubs available to Korea University students.

Q7: What job search tools does KUBS provide?

A7: KUBS offers robust career support through the KUBS Career Development Center, providing job information, a career acceleration program, and a CV book for companies seeking talent (visit: [Korea University Business School] [Career Development Center] Enhance Your Career at KUBS Career Hub).

Q8: In what fields do KUBS graduates typically find employment?

A8: Graduates of KUBS GMBA embark on careers across a broad spectrum of industries, including manufacturing, banking, and entertainment. To align with these varied career pathways, the curriculum undergoes continuous updates. For example, in the academic year 2023, new courses were introduced on the gaming industry and media/entertainment. These additions reflect Korea's expanding impact in these sectors and underscore our commitment to innovation and relevance in our educational offerings.

Application Process Questions

Q9: Do I need to get both the diploma and the transcript apostilled?

A9: If you graduated from a university abroad, you must obtain an apostille for your diploma or certificate of expected graduation and submit it either by mail or in-person to the office. The transcript can be submitted as an original document either by mail or in-person to the office.

Q10: If my highest level of education is a graduate school, do I only need to submit the graduate school diploma and transcript?

A10: Even if your highest level of education is a graduate school, you must also submit the diploma and transcript from the university you graduated from previously. Therefore, you need to submit both the diploma and transcript from the undergraduate university and the graduate school.

Q11: What if an expected graduation certificate from my undergraduate school is not available?

A11: If an expected graduation certificate is unavailable, an official letter featuring the university's letterhead, your name, expected graduation date, and an authorized signature (e.g., the dean's) serves as an acceptable alternative.

Q12: What scholarships does KUBS offer?

A12: KUBS offers an admission scholarship. Selection is based on the applicant's abilities, potential for future growth, financial need, etc. It's crucial to apply for this scholarship as part of your application process.

Q13: What additional documents are considered by KUBS?

A13: KUBS values documents that highlight your abilities and potential for growth. This includes, but is not limited to, internship experiences and GMAT/GRE scores, among others that may support your application.

Q14: What types of recommendation letters are accepted and how should they be submitted?

A14: Recommendation letters, sealed and authored by academic or professional references outside of KUBS

faculty, must be submitted directly to our office by the deadline, either by mail or in person.
